The Rincon Band of Luiseño Indians, who debuted their Rincon Reservation Road Brewery (3R Brewery) in January 2020, is proud to announce the debut of their first off-reservation tasting room in Ocean Beach. With a private grand opening planned for Saturday, January 15, 2022, the new tasting room will open to the public on Sunday, January 16 at Noon. Since its debut in Valley Center, 3R Brewery has been named one of "12 Best New Breweries of 2021" by *Hop Culture* and is quickly making a name for itself in the national craft beer space. The new Ocean Beach tasting room will open initially with 12 taps including Red Rattler Amber Ale, Chief IPA, Luiseño Hazy IPA, Oasis Blonde, Rez Dog Hefeweizen, Tuupash Blueberry Saison, Alaawaka Spiced Hefeweizen, Oatmeal Stout and Coffee Stout. Sidewalk Vending Ordinance

The proposed ordinance has been kicked down the road again. The new City council President says hie will this on. The City of San Diego has been without an ordinance regulating sidewalk vending for almost two years. The OBMA, OBTC, OB Planning Board, The Peninsula Alliance and OBCDC have been working over those two years to bring common sense back and pass a reasonable sidewalk vending ordinance.

It's important for those who have strong opinions on this subject to understand that the State law which nullified the old San Diego vending ordinance does not allow an argument about economic competition as seen in section 2-51038(e): For purposes of this section, perceived community animus or economic competition does not constitute an objective health, safety, or welfare concern.

We understand that many of our brick and mortar businesses are having trouble with the idea that some vendors operating private businesses can operate on City land free of charge and seemingly not have to abide by the same regulations that brick and mortar businesses have to. All we can do is read the State Senate bill 946 below and speak to its content when approaching our elected officials. Click here for a link to the current elected officials. The bill would authorize a local authority to, by ordinance or resolution, adopt additional requirements regulating the time, place, and manner of sidewalk vending, as specified, if the requirements are directly related to objective health, safety, or welfare concerns. The bill would also authorize a local authority to prohibit sidewalk vendors in areas located within the immediate vicinity of a permitted certified farmers' market and a permitted swap meet, as specified, and to restrict or prohibit sidewalk vendors within the immediate vicinity of an area designated for a temporary special permit issued by the local authority, as specified. . .

In a nutshell, our City leaders can regulate sidewalk vendors but they would need to follow the guidelines found in Senate Bill 946 above. If you contact your elected officials, please formulate your comments based on what the City Council has the authority to do within a sidewalk vending ordinance.
