* Summer Saver season runs from May through October. Bill credit is given the month following the Summer Saver season.

SDG&E has an agreement with a third party, Comverge, Inc., to provide the technology and administer the Summer Saver program. Comverge is responsible for installing, removing and servicing the wireless unit.

This program is funded by California utility customers and bill credits are administered by SDG&E, under the auspices of the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC). Actual participation in Summer Saver is based on your effective date. The effective date is the day that the cycling device was installed. OB Community Cleanup/Recycling Event

Eliminate clutter and get rid of unwanted items by donating or recycling them at the City of San Diego's Community Cleanup/Recycling Event - Saturday, October 13, 8am to 1pm, next to Robb Field in Ocean Beach. Please enter off of West Point Loma Blvd. at Abbott St.

This event is designed to help Ocean Beach residents properly dispose of or recycle bulky items that do not fit in the City's refuse collection or curbside recycling containers. This is a partnership between Zero Waste San Diego, Ocean Beach Community Development Committee (CDC), Ocean Beach Town Council and the City of San Diego Environmental Services Department (ESD) to provide expanded recycling and reuse opportunities for residents of OB. Help us keep these recyclable and reusable items out of the landfill.

Acceptable Items:

- **Appliances**
- Carpeting
- Electronics (such as TVs, computer monitors, VCRs, and CPUs)
- Cell phones and Laser/Inkjet printer cartridges
- (donations will go to the Point Loma High School Foundation and Alumni Association)
- Yard trimmings (Grass, leaves, shrub clippings less than 4' long and no one piece more than 6" in diameter, and bundled in lengths no longer than 4', tied with string on both ends, and weighing no more than 50 pounds)

- Dirt, construction materials, or demolition rubble
- Household hazardous wastes (paint, batteries, motor oil)
